Keynote Speaker Naoto HISAJIMA



Yasushi AKASHI

Director-General, Secretariat of the International Peace Cooperation Headquarters, Cabinet Office, since 2020. Mr. Hisajima served in many other capacities including Director, Climate Change of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan (MOFA) and Director, United Nations Policy Division, MOFA. He was Minister, Permanent Mission of Japan to the United Nations, New York and in 2019 was appointed Director-General, Disarmament, Non-proliferation and Science, MOFA.

Mr. Akashi graduated from the University of Tokyo in 1954. As a Fulbright Scholar, he studied at the University of Virginia and later at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy. He joined the United Nations Secretariat in 1957 and held numerous positions in the UN. After serving as Ambassador at the Permanent Mission of Japan to the United Nations, he was appointed as UN Under-Secretary-General for Public Information and later for Disarmament Affairs, Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Cambodia and then for the Former Yugoslavia, and then Under-Secretary-General

for Humanitarian Affairs until the end of 1997. He is currently Chairman of the Kyoto International Conference Center and Vice-President of the United Nations Association of Japan.

Tatakhiro SHINYO



Professor Takahiro SHINYO graduated from Osaka University in 1972 and joined the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan. In 1987 he became the counselor of the Japanese embassy in Germany. In 1989, he returned to Japan to assume the head of the Disarmament Division in the United Nations Bureau in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and then became the Director of the UN Policy Division in 1991. In 1999 he became Deputy Director-General of the European and Oceanic Affairs Bureau at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. In 2002 he became the Consul General of Japan in

Düsseldorf. In 2006 he became Ambassador and Deputy Permanent Representative of Japan to the United Nations. From 2008 to 2011 he was the Ambassador of Japan to the Federal Republic of Germany. In April 2012, Professor SHINYO was appointed a Vice President at Kwansei Gakuin University and the Director-General of the International Strategy Office of the University.

Dr. Cedric de Coning is a research professor at the Norwegian Institute of International Affairs (NUPI), where he also coordinates the Effectiveness of Peace Operations Network (EPON). He is also a senior advisor for ACCORD.
